As I review the past few weeks' activities, Touchstone Energy NEXT Conference as well as NREDA's strategic planning, I'm reminded of the words of a mentor of mine who has since passed away, Dr. C. William Swank, CEO of the Ohio Farm Bureau Federation. With a tip of the hat, I am admiring and acquiring some of Dr. Swank's thoughts.

In 1985 Dr. Swank spoke on the value of gathering. Gathering to work on complex problems of the day, and when I read these issues such as inflation, energy, and trade, many are still concerning today. Additional issues range from workforce housing, energy sustainability, to aging or nonexistent infrastructure and giving every person in our communities a chance to succeed.

And that rings true of the past week or so. We gathered with friends and colleagues from across this nation to work on issues that hold back rural communities in America.

Whom do you gather with, how, and when? Gathering today, especially after 2020 has taken on a whole different light than some 37 years ago. I suggest, gathering with your fellow economic development practitioners is a great way to acquire education, information, and outside thought to solve the problems of the day.

NREDA is your organization specifically designed to facilitate gathering but requires you to interact and take part. There are several programs NREDA offers to help you access information, education, and experience.

- Webinars are held on topics such as Community Wellness, Planning for Site Selection, and Entrepreneurship.
- The monthly newsletter keeps you updated on current topics and legislation. A mentorship program is available, not only to new members but also on the specific subject matter.
- Your annual meeting, which is in Albuquerque, New Mexico tops off the year and will be full of information on site selection, the power of connecting, as well as an opportunity to speak with fellow practitioners.
